Meeting called to order at 6:05pm

Road Report- Rodney Hoyt

Hoyt discusses two different bids for grant work on Mary White and the bottom half of Dickerman. Sharon called to ask if we can bring our 10-wheeler up to help them with some resurfacing. Hoyt told them they could because they sent their mower up here for three or four days last summer. Hoyt discusses some culvert issues that were brought up on Monarch Hill. This is a driveway culvert that is the responsibility of the property owner. Mullen stated that he would take care of it with his tractor this week since it is not the town's responsibility.

Elaine Howe is having the VOCA (Vermont Old Cemetery Association) come in August. She is looking for help from the town with material to fix the stones and a dump truck for brush. She will know more as it gets closer but is hoping to have the towns support.

Howe also asks about getting a Memorial Day Wreath for the pocket park. Pat Ladd usually makes it but cannot do it this year. Hoyt stated he will talk Leyna Hoyt and see if she can make a wreath for the parade.

LEMP Approval

Every year we have to submit this to the state. Once it is signed, this goes to the State of Vermont. They also require a Selectboard Liaison. Gary Mullen volunteers for this. McPhetres makes a motion to approve the LEMP. O'Brien seconds. All aye. So moved.

Town Forest Committee Update

Town Forest Committee meeting last week covered the discussion of the lumber sawed out. Two piles are for covered bridges and the other piles were voted on to donate to Rudi Ruddell for siding his new house. The second discussion item was putting in a driveway up to the pavilion. Matt Loftus said he could put the driveway in for \$4500 from their funds. McPhetres makes a motion to allow the Town Forest Committee to donate the lumber to Ruddell and fix the road. O'Brien seconds. All aye. So moved.

Radar Speed Feedback Sign Purchase

Cilley presents the Selectboard with an estimate she received from WorkSafe for Radar Speed Signs. The total cost for the units along with new posts is \$11,086.76. McPhetres makes a motion to purchase the signs. O'Brien seconds. All aye. So moved.

Liquor License Approval

McPhetres makes a motion to approve all liquor licenses. O'Brien seconds. All aye. So moved.

Other Business:

Adam Kenyon discusses capping off the shed to put the mowers and snow blowers and

wheelbarrow over there. Kenyon asks if there has been any further discussion on the recycling stickers for Tunbridge Residents. Kenyon also states that there has been an issue with someone coming in off hours and hitting the lock on the recycling container. Kenyon has replaced the locks and given Hoyt some spare keys. Kenyon has been mowing and is hoping to get a new weedwacker from Aubuchon. The Selectboard asks him to get a quote for the one he is looking at and to come back to them next meeting.
